Recent and forthcoming conferences hosted by the Institute of English Studies

- **The Fifth International Conference on Philosophy of Language and Linguistics, PhiLang2017, 12-14 May 2017, Łódź, Poland**

The Department of English and General Linguistics at University of Łódź announces the Fifth International Conference on Philosophy of Language and Linguistics, PhiLang2017.

As in previous years, the principal aim of the conference is to bring together philosophers, logicians and linguists. PhiLang2017 will be concerned with "objects of inquiry" (or with "what there is") in language, logic, argumentation theory, philosophy, and literature. We also invite contributions investigating the relations between philosophy of language, philosophy of literature, and philosophy of mind. The following plenary speakers have been invited: Göran Rossholm (Stockholm University), Brendan S. Gillon (McGill University), Peter Pagin (Stockholm University), Alberto Voltolini (University of Turin), and Maciej Witek (University of Szczecin).

Two special sessions are also included in this edition of the conference. A workshop on **Wallace Stevens** will address all aspects of his poetic praxis as well as Stevens' theoretical writings reflecting this praxis (<http://filologia.uni.lodz.pl/philang/Stevens>). The second, on the **Philosophy of Argumentation** is dedicated to exploring the relationship between Linguistics and Philosophy of Language and Argumentation, as well as general aspects of argumentation theory (<http://filologia.uni.lodz.pl/philang/Argumentation>).

Selected conference proceedings will be published in monographic volumes in the new series of Peter Lang *Studies in Philosophy of Language and Linguistics* (<https://www.peterlang.com/view/serial/SPLL>).

- **The 8th Lodz Symposium New Developments in Linguistic Pragmatics (NDLP2017), 15-17 May 2017, Łódź, Poland**

This 8th edition of the NDLP conference series aims to respond to a surge of new research in pragmatics, with a view to bringing together the novel, empirically, experimentally and clinically based models, and classical topics/frameworks such as Gricean pragmatics, Speech Act Theory and presupposition. We encourage papers (re-)examining the semantics-pragmatics boundary, which has been sometimes blurred by the confrontation of the new and the traditional frameworks. Proposals are welcome at the intersection of the philosophy of language and pragmatics dealing with theoretical, methodological and definitional issues, as well as issues of interdisciplinarity in pragmatic investigation.

While we specially encourage presentations of theoretical approaches which have a basis in empirical studies, or allow for experimentally testable predictions, the conference continues to be open to all kinds of pragmatics oriented research recognizing pragmatics as a functional (i.e. cognitive, social

and cultural) perspective on language and communication. This applies to functional studies involving multiple and heterogeneous territories: everyday discourse, (online) media, education, political and professional settings, problems of linguistic construction and maintenance of identity, communicative genres, issues of multilingualism and linguistic pluralism, pragmatic aspects of translation, pragmatic awareness in foreign language teaching, and more.

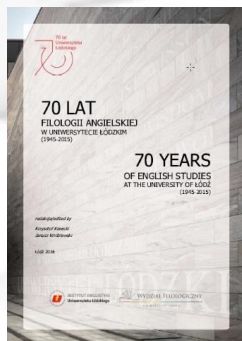

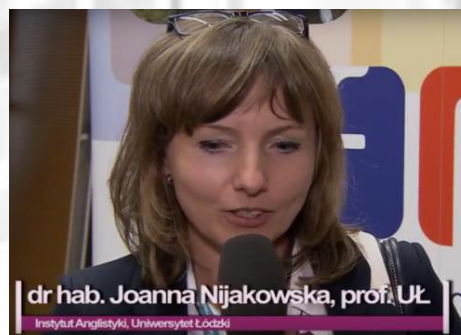
- **Stanisław Goźdz-Roszkowski at the Heidelberg Academy of Sciences, Germany**

Geoffrey Chaucer Student Society celebrated this year's Christmas season by visiting the National Museum in Warsaw (17th December 2016). The society organizes regular meetings devoted to medieval and early modern English literature as well as special events such as summer schools or field trips. This year the destination was the medieval section of the National Museum, rich in late medieval iconography of the saints and visual representations of the Annunciation, Nativity, Harrowing of Hell and Crucifixion, which the students could confront with the dramatic retellings of these episodes from the English mystery cycles. The visit was accompanied by a seminar led by dr Piotr Spyra, the society's academic supervisor.
